138/2023 Homeless Crisis

WHEREAS the homeless crisis is taking a devastating toll on families and communities, undermining a healthy and prosperous Ontario;

AND WHEREAS the homelessness crisis is the result of the underinvestment;

AND WHEREAS homelessness requires a range of affordable housing, social service and health solutions from government;

AND WHEREAS homelessness is felt most at the level of local government and the residents that they serve;

AND WHEREAS municipalities and District Social Administration Boards are doing their part, but do not have the resources, capacity or tools to address this complex challenge;

AND WHEREAS leadership and urgent action is needed from the provincial government on an emergency basis to develop, resource, and implement a comprehensive plan to prevent, reduce and ultimately end homelessness in Ontario.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of the Corporation of the Township of McGarry calls on the Provincial Government to urgently:

- a) acknowledge that homelessness in Ontario is a social, economic, and health crisis;
- b) commit to ending homelessness in Ontario; and
- c) work with AMO and a broad range of community, health, Indigenous and economic partners to develop, resource, and implement an action plan to achieve this goal.

AND FINALLY THAT a copy of this motion be addressed to the Premier of Ontario, copying the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing; Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services; Ministry of Health, Timiskaming District Social Services Administration Board (TDSSAB, Association of Ontario (AMO), Federation of Northern Ontario Municipalities (FONOM); MPP Cochrane-Timiskaming, MP Timmins-James Bay, and all municipalities within the District of Timiskaming.
